- I'm a fourth generation Oregonian who has been paying electric bills since the 1970s.
- I have an undergraduate accounting degree from the University of Oregon and a
 minor in Economics/Accounting at the Ph.D. level from Carnegie-Mellon University

 and many years ago I worked as a Division Finance Manager at Tektronix. I can
 speak with authority and confidence about the economic aspects of Oregon's solar
 programs.
- This week, I had 39 Samsung solar panels mounted on my roof as a result of Oregon's new solar feed-in tariff program.
