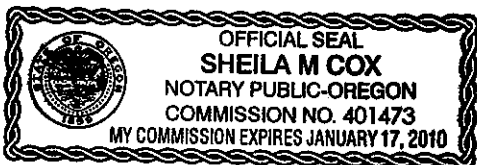

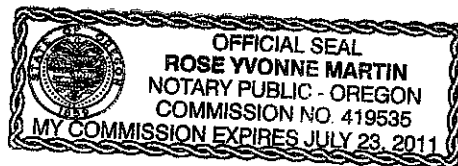

Information about a **proposed electricity price change**, and how PGE can help you use electricity wisely.

On Feb. 27, Portland General Electric filed a request with the Oregon Public Utility Commission (OPUC) for a general rate revision to increase rates 8.9 percent, or \$145.9 million annually in 2009. It is the first step in a thorough ten-month public process. The actual rate change may vary from the request based on the outcome of the public process.

The proposed price increase covers:

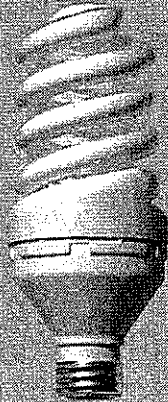
- *increased fuel and wholesale power costs.*
- *increased costs for operations, maintenance and new regulatory compliance requirements.*
- *costs for relicensing existing hydroelectric projects, improving fish passage and for other capital improvements.*

PGE works to keep prices reasonable despite increasing demand and costs

As our area has grown, the demand for electricity has also grown. Meanwhile, the price of the basic materials PGE needs to serve our customers—such as wire, poles and transformers—has gone up an average of 77 percent over the same five-year period. We've worked to cut costs and be more efficient wherever we can. Adjusted for inflation, the average cost of PGE service for residential customers has remained flat since 1984.

What's the bottom line for PGE customers?

If approved, the average price change for Schedule 7 residential customers would be 9.5 percent. The average price change for Schedule 32 business customers would be 7.7 percent. And the average price change for Schedule 83 and 89 commercial and industrial customers would be 8.4 percent. The average PGE residential customer using 900 kilowatt-hours per month would see an \$8.76 increase in their monthly bill.

You can have a say in the process

Prices are set for Oregon's investor-owned utilities in an open, transparent process called a rate case. It is conducted by the OPUC and includes involvement from customer groups, local governments and others.
