I have reviewed all cross-examination statements submitted by parties, and have determined that the hearing scheduled in the above-captioned docket should be cancelled. No party requested the opportunity to cross-examine any witness. Cancellation of the hearing is noticed below.

Parties wishing to admit testimony should do so by motion. Testimony must be sworn to, and if testimony was not submitted with an affidavit as to the truth of the testimony, the motion to admit the testimony should be submitted with such an affidavit.¹

Parties should also have an opportunity for briefing. Parties should informally confer regarding a schedule to submit motions, affidavits and briefs. If parties agree on proposed dates, I ask that one party send me a letter, by electronic mail or other means, informing me, no later than the close of business on May 3, 2006, of the proposed schedule. If parties do not agree on a schedule, I ask each party to send a letter with proposed schedule dates, by electronic mail or other means, by the close of business on May 3, 2006.

NOTICE IS GIVEN that the Public Utility Commission of Oregon has canceled the hearing scheduled for May 2-3, 2006, in this proceeding, and that it may be rescheduled at a later date.
