MEMORANDUM REGARDING
SCHEDULE FOR ORAL
ARGUMENT

The Commission will conduct an oral argument in this proceeding on January 5, 2023, at 9:00 a.m. We will launch the Zoom meeting at approximately 8:45 a.m. to provide time for everyone to get set up and join the meeting.

Based on the parties' positions, the oral argument will be structured to address the topics listed below. The below agenda identifies the parties that will be participating in the order in which they will be presenting. This schedule assumes that PacifiCorp, dba Pacific Power, will provide argument for the stipulating parties and that Vitesse will not be participating in the oral argument. If this is not correct, Vitesse or PacifiCorp may contact the Administrative Hearings Division, and I will adjust the below schedule accordingly.

Please note that the Commissioners will attend the oral argument, and the time allotted includes the time to address any questions from the Commissioners. Parties should be prepared to address questions from the Commissioners and should anticipate questions starting within the first few minutes of their presentations.

While parties may use screen sharing to the extent necessary to show an exhibit for illustrative purposes, we ask that parties not rely on PowerPoint for oral argument.
