DISPOSITION: CONSOLIDATE ISSUES LISTS; PUBLIC COMMENT FILE AVAILABLE; NEW EMAIL ADDRESS FOR COMMUNICATIONS; NEW LEGAL ASSISTANT

On May 13, 2004, the parties filed a total of 14 issues lists. Many of the issues are similar but worded slightly differently. The parties should make every effort to consolidate the various lists during the June 8 and 9 settlement conferences, and submit a consolidated list on or before the June 18<sup>th</sup> status conference.

As the parties are aware, public comment has been solicited during the initial open houses and town halls. The Commission has received, and will continue to receive, public comment in the form of letters, electronic mail messages, and telephone calls. All such comments are being placed in a separate public comment file within the case file, and are available for viewing at the Administrative Hearings Division.

Some parties have written letters to other governmental entities and sent copies of the letter to the Commissioners. Those letters have also been placed in the public comment file, and are not docketed. Parties are reminded to serve all persons on the service list when sending these letters to the Commissioners.

Finally, Legal Assistant Trudy Jaynes will no longer be with the Commission after June 4, 2004. Due to this personnel change, a new email box has been established for all UM 1121 electronic mail involving the Administrative Hearings Division.
